Vision

The Kandolhu Maldives team, led by our senior leaders, is committed to environmental protection and strives to reduce our island's environmental impact.

Goals

Through our environmental policy, we will:

- Ensure we comply with all applicable environmental laws and regulations.
- Measure our environmental performance against our objectives and targets, making sure that we regularly review our progress and continuously look for ways to improve.
- Train our team members on our environmental commitments, so that everyone understands the role they play in delivering our objectives and targets; and
- Invite our guests to support our efforts to reduce our environmental impact.

Objectives

To achieve our environmental goals, we will:

- Achieve and maintain our Travelife status for Hotels and Accommodations award.
- Reduce our energy consumption
 - a. By continuing to use appliances that are energy-saving class A.
 - b. Installing motion sensors to reduce AC running hours.
- Reduce our water consumption by
 - a. Involving our guests to support our towel and bed linen reuse program.
 - b. Installing water flow restrictors in the taps and showers.
- Reduce the waste
 - a. Continuing to separate all our waste streams, including glass, paper, cardboard, etc.
 - b. By identifying opportunities to reuse or recycle these materials,
 - c. By using all wet garbage from the kitchens to make compost for our garden
- Reduce the use of potentially harmful chemicals in our day-to-day operations by:
 - a. Finding biodegradable or natural alternatives.
- Reduce plastic bottles by
 - a. Replacing soft plastic drink bottles in the mini bars with glass bottles or aluminium cans.
 - b. Introduce Kandolhu glass bottles and water dispensers around the island so that our team can make sure of this, thereby further reducing our reliance on plastic.
 - c. Replacing single-use plastic toiletry bottles with refillable bottles.
 - d. Bulk buying of shampoo, conditioner and shower gel for guest rooms.

- Supporting biodiversity protection
 - a. Conservation efforts to protect our island flora and fauna, and plant them in our nursery.
 - b. Avoid activities that may harm or disturb sensitive ecosystems
 - c. Support local biodiversity preservation initiatives through partnerships and financial contribution
 - d. Supporting The Olive Ridley Project to protect sea turtles, we have adopted Ufaa a green sea turtle.
 - e. Introduction of QR code to reduce the printing of paper.
