Sustainability at Kandolhu Maldives

At Kandolhu Maldives, we recognise that our operations are inextricably linked to the delicate ecosystems surrounding us, and we are therefore continually striving to refine and enhance our impact on both the local community and the natural environment. Our steadfast commitment is centred upon the systematic reduction of our greenhouse gas emissions and the vigilant protection of the region's rich biodiversity—with a particular focus on the fragile marine ecosystems that define the Maldives as a truly peerless destination.

In alignment with this long-term vision, we formally set a 2026 target to achieve a 25% reduction in greenhouse gas emissions. We are aiming to reduce our energy consumption by 15% in switching to solar, water by 10%, and waste by 20% by 2030, utilising our 2025 performance data as the primary baseline for measurement.

While we take pride in our progress, we remain acutely aware that the stewardship of our island requires ongoing and more intensive efforts. Throughout 2026, we are actively deploying a suite of strategic initiatives across the full spectrum of our resort operations to ensure we remain on a steadfast trajectory toward our 2030 objectives. These comprehensive measures include implementing advanced energy-efficiency protocols, radically reducing single-use items, and rigorously enhancing our waste segregation and responsible disposal frameworks, all of which are designed to harmonise with local regulatory requirements and the existing regional infrastructure.

We earnestly invite our esteemed guests, dedicated staff members, and valued suppliers to join us in these endeavours by adhering to the instructional reminders and sustainability guidance distributed across the resort. Contributions toward these collective goals can be made through mindful actions such as conserving water and energy, consciously minimising food waste, and actively participating in our established recycling and reuse programs wherever they are available.

Furthermore, because the health of our terrestrial environment is profoundly interconnected with the vitality of the surrounding coral reefs and aquatic species, we place the highest priority on fostering responsible marine conduct. We respectfully request that our guests help preserve local biodiversity by strictly following reef-safe snorkelling and diving protocols, refraining from any physical contact with coral colonies or marine wildlife, and maintaining deep respect for designated protected zones and seasonal ecological sensitivities.

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
